

#### AGROECOLOGY AND CLIMATE CHANGE

[Last year] I joined a group of writers to help write and edit a new book in the Barefoot Guide Agroecology series. The goal was to quickly produce a book (in time to be shared at the COP 27 Climate meetings) about Agroecology's role in addressing climate change. It took many late nights of writing, and early morning conversations, but we did it!



This book is published by the Alliance for Food Sovereignty in Africa (AFSA).

From AFSA: "This book takes you on a unique journey through Africa's diverse food systems and the threats they face as a result of the climate emergency, as well as the industrial food system's barrage of false climate solutions. Aside from the doom and gloom, this book offers stories of hope and regeneration from African farmers, pastoralists, fishers, indigenous peoples, women, and youth from all over the continent."

My role as a writer was to help draft a scientifically accurate but easily understandable narrative showing how biology regulates the climate and how agroecology can help provide climate mitigation and resilience. The Fact sheets we created in the Land and Leadership Initiative's Seed Media Project were a big help.

Getting to do purposeful work with a dedicated team is one of the great pleasures of life, and AFSA is an amazing organization. Last year I got to teach in AFSA's Healthy Soil Healthy Food Initiative, and two other free Barefoot Guides came out of that project: Healthy Soil For Healthy Communities: An Introduction to Soil Health Practices for Africa, and My Food is African: Healthy Soil, Safe Food, and Diverse Diets.
