NFCA 12TH ANNUAL MEETING

In March, the co-operators across the Northeast gathered for the Neighboring Food Co-op Association's 12th Annual Meeting. Tina Barney, our Board President, was one of those in attendance, and had this to say about the event:

"This first in-person NFCA annual meeting since COVID emphasized time for connection and networking, culminating with small group discussions on 14 different topics. I joined the Small Co-op cadre, where we shared ideas on community engagement, challenges from distributors that can arbitrarily increase minimum order levels, sales of conventional produce, appeal to a broader range of customers, and meaningful financial data to share with Boards and members. I spoke with people who have or are undergoing GM searches, largely with happy endings, which left me hopeful that our search will be successful."

Another part of the celebration was the honoring of our Co-GM Sue Miller, has served two years as President of the NFCA Board of Directors: "[Sue's] unflagging commitment to the NFCA, our original vision, and our Member Co-ops has made all the difference, especially



in the last few years of the uncertainty and instability brought on by the pandemic. We wish her all the best in her retirement and look forward to finding new ways to work together."
